



# THE MUSIC HALL TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

Stage: 42' x 34' x 40', Seating Capacity: 686

*The Music Hall is the centerpiece for performing arts at Snug Harbor. Built in 1892, it is the second oldest music hall in the northeast, younger than Carnegie Hall by six months. The Music Hall accommodates larger audiences and adequately supports performance requirements. Past performers include David Bowie, Wanda Sykes, Al Martino, Tony Randall, Kitty Carlisle, Diahann Carroll, the Drifters, the Platters, the Coasters, Ingrid Michaelson, Galt MacDermot, Lady GaGa, Nora Jones, The XX, and more.*

## **FACILITY SPECIFICATIONS:**

### **Main Level (entrance)**

- Orchestra 461 seats
- Vestibule and lobby
- Box office
- Restrooms for disabled guests
- ADA accessible entry via ramp, seating for 10 wheelchairs orchestra level only
- Orchestra pit accommodates five to six musicians

### **Balcony Level**

- Lobby
- Balcony 225 seats
- Lighting booth and spot bridge
- Public restrooms

Accommodations for handicapped on main level only

### **Stage**

- Stage 42' w x 34'd
- Proscenium 36' w x 32' h 1' deep
- Grid 36' h 20' x 20' black schedule 40 pipe 12,000 lbs. UDL
- No house curtain green teaser with legs on proscenium, black legs stage left and right, black curtain upstage which opens to reveal stretched muslin projection screen on frame.
- Load in doors are upstage left and right directly onto deck. There are two small steps from the street level. ADA access via portable ramp.

- House dimmers - ETC sensor rack with 72 channels expandable to 96 channels
- House console – ETC Insight
- Basic rep plot includes Par 64's & 56's | Altman Voyager 400 watt HTI long throw spotlight
- Sound
- Main speaker clusters – flown off truss stage left and right – Clair Brothers audio CAT III 214 System
- Console Midas Legend L3/40/TP 40 + 4 x 8. Dual power supplies
