Customers may pick up their order at Snug Harbor on October 16 and 17 from 10:00 AM – 3:00 PM. Pickups will take place in parking lot P1 by the red barn. Customers are advised to enter Snug Harbor through the East Gate at Fillmore Street and Tysen Ave, and make an immediate left into the parking lot. Snug Harbor staff members will be waiting with your order tracked by your last name. Customers are advised to bring a large

container for their bulbs and wear masks and gloves.

Customers will also have the opportunity to ask questions in person at the upcoming Autumn Bulb Workshop on October 8 and 10 from 1:00 PM – 2:00 PM. The free workshop will be held outdoors, and attendees are asked to follow pandemic safety procedures such as wearing a mask and maintaining a 6 foot distance from others. Attendees will learn which bulbs will be best for their spaces, how to plant their spring garden and overwinter bulbs, pest control, and how to lay out planting to accentuate their landscape.
